R.E.A.D. the Bible

The Bible is the **word of God** and the **wisdom of God**, and knowing the holy scriptures makes you know the true God (2 Timothy 3:15) and know true wisdom (2 Timothy 3:16-17).

R - Read in your Bible

(Proverbs 8:32-33)

Read the **whole Bible** like you would read other books; read every **word**, every **verse**, every **chapter**, and every **book**, **cover-to-cover**. Don't merely memorize or study the Bible, but read it by passing through the whole Bible intelligently.

Deuteronomy 17:19 "And it shall be with him, and he shall read therein all the days of his life ..."

E _ Early in your Day

(Proverbs 8:17)

Read the Bible **early in the morning**, as soon as you wake up. Begin your day with heavenly **truth**, not with any worldly **things**.

Psalm 63:1 "O God, thou art my God; **early will I seek thee**: my soul thirsteth for thee, my flesh longeth for thee in a dry and thirsty land, where no water is"

A - Aloud in your Voice

(Proverbs 8:6-8)

Read the Bible **out loud** whenever possible, reading **with your voice** instead of just **in your head**. This will intensify your *attention*, improve your *pronunciation*, and increase your *retention* of the Bible.

Psalm 119:13 "With my lips have I declared all the judgments of thy mouth."

D - paily in your Life

(Proverbs 8:34)

Read the Bible **every day** without fail; never let a day go by in which you have not read the word of God, it is the one needful thing to do on a daily basis (Luke 10:38-42).

Acts 17:11 "they ... searched the scriptures daily, whether those things were so."

The Manna and the Word


The Bible is your **daily bread** in the wilderness of this world, just as the **manna** was the daily bread of the Israelites in the wilderness.

Daily Plan

The manna was **gathered** by the Israelites **by a certain rate** per person (Exodus 16:16), just as we should determine a certain minimum number of pages of the word of God every time we read. When the Israelites did not eat all of the manna they gathered, it **rotted** (Exodus 16:19-20).



Daily Practice

Manna was **gotten** by the Israelites **to be eaten every day** (Exodus 16:4), just as we should read the word of God every day. Bible reading should not be missed any day. When the Israelites did not eat the manna, they **hungered** (Exodus 16:27).






M.A.R.K. Your Bible

When you read the Bible, the Bible reads you (Hebrews 4:12). You should read the Bible *carefully*, considerately, and critically. Don't read it **to** understand, **read and understand** (Matthew 24:15)





Attend the H.O.U.S.E. of God

Continue steadfastly in the **Christian church-life** (Acts 2:42), not only visiting church for a single service, but dwelling there for life (Psalm 23:6; 84:4, 10): don't

be a church **visitor**, be a church **dweller**!



- Hear God's Word

Come to church **happily** and **ready to learn** (Psalm 122:1), **listening attentively** to the preaching of the Bible (Nehemiah 8:3).



Revelation 3:22 "He that hath an ear, **let him hear** what the Spirit saith unto the churches."



- Offer God's Sacrifices

Participate in every aspect of the church services (Romans 12:1), offering to God the spiritual sacrifices of your **praise**, **prayer**, and **presents** (Psalm 100:2, 4).

Hebrews 13:15-16 "15 By him therefore let us offer **the sacrifice of praise** to God continually, that is, the fruit of our lips **giving thanks to his name**. 16 But to do good and to communicate forget not: for **with such sacrifices** God is well pleased."



- Unite with God's People

Fellowship **before** and **after** the church services with the members (Psalm 16:3), making friends of God's children (Proverbs 13:20; 27:17).



Psalm 119:63 "I am a companion of all them that fear thee, and of them that keep thy precepts."





Get **involved** in the work of the ministry (1 Corinthians 12:27), **volunteering** to do needed work for the Lord.

Ephesians 4:16 "From whom the whole body fitly joined together and compacted by that which **every joint supplieth**, according to the effectual working in the measure of **every**

part, maketh increase of the body unto the
 edifying of itself in love."

Enact God's Truth

Change your **beliefs** and your **behaviour** in accordance with the truth that is taught (Luke 8:18), applying everything you hear to yourself (Lamentations 3:40).

James 1:22 "But be ye doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving your own selves."


Criteria of a Good Church

A church is a **gathering of believers in Jesus Christ to fulfill the Great Commission** (Matthew 28:18-20). The *precepts*, *principles*, and *practices* of the Bible is the foundation of the church (1 Timothy 3:15; Ephesians 2:20).

A true believer will not be a member of a false church (1 John 4:1-6; see also John 10:1-5). Only go to a church which meets these **three biblical requirements**:

The Right Way to God

A good church will preach the **biblical gospel**




Romans 16:17 "Now I beseech you, brethren, **mark them** which cause divisions and offences contrary to the doctrine which ye have learned; and **avoid them**."



The Right Word of God

A good church will teach **biblical doctrine**



Titus 1:9 "Holding fast **the faithful word** as he hath been taught, that he may be able by **sound doctrine** both to exhort and to convince the gainsayers."



The Right **Works** of God

A good church will have a biblical ministry

Church is for the **servants of God**, so the church must hold up and assist God's people (Ephesians 4:11-15). Go to a church which serves and edifies the people (Acts 20:20; Revelation 2:4-5).

Acts 5:42 "And daily in the **temple**, and in **every house**, they ceased not to **teach and preach Jesus Christ**."



Take N.O.T.E.S. in Church

Every time you are being taught in church, you should **take notes**, and show yourself to be approved to God (2 Timothy 2:15); if you do not take notes, the knowledge you seem to have will be **taken away from you** (Luke 8:18).

Idleness Iesus Christ and my righteous life:

Be on T.I.M.E.

"Early is on time, on time is late, late is unacceptable"

A godly person thinks about time, but a foolish person doesn't regard time at all (Colossians 4:5; Romans 13:11). If you want others and God to be on time for you, then you should **be on time** for them (Matthew 7:12; Psalm 70:5).

Sins of Tardiness

When you are late, you are...

Disorderly

leading an indecent life

Those who are never on time do not have an organized life, but are **idle** and **lacking self-control**. God is not on "African Time", and is not slack as men (2 Peter 3:9); when he sets an appointed time, he keeps it (Exodus 9:5-6; Genesis 21:2).

1 Corinthians 14:33, 40 "33 For God is not the author of **confusion**, but of peace, as in all churches of the saints. 40 Let all things be done **decently and in order**."

Dishonest

leading an insincere life

People that cannot keep time are **liars** (Proverbs 12:19-20), which attend their appointments and meetings late when they are expected to be on time. Late people are **unfaithful** and **untrustworthy**.

Colossians 3:9 "Lie not one to another, seeing that ye have put off the old man with his deeds"

Disrespectful

leading an inconsiderate life


When you are always running late, you are basically saying that your time is more important than the time of others, as a lord whom everyone has to wait upon (Mark 10:42). You cannot respect someone but disrespect their time.

Philippians 2:3-4 "...in lowliness of mind let each esteem other better than themselves. Look not every man on his own things, but every man also on the things of others."

Tips for Being on Time

Bad things happen in your life when you tarry longer than the set time appointed (2 Samuel 20:4-5). There are four things you can do in order to always be on T.I.M.E.



1970 distractions from time

place: keys, bags, tools, clothing/shoes, etc.

Leave alone the **non-essential things** that threaten to make you late for appointments: chores, unfinished business, etc. Make reasons why you should be on time, not excuses for being late.

be Mindful of the time

Have a watch/time keeper with you at all times.

Know the time, checking periodically; plan your time, apportioning it appropriately.

Early every time

Be early for everything you do. Have an aim to be present at least 5-15 minutes before the appointed time. If you are not early, you are late.

Dress M.O.D.E.S.T.

The essence of modesty is that one **does not draw attention to themselves**. 1 Timothy 2:9 "In like manner also, that women adorn themselves in modest apparel, with shamefacedness and sobriety; not with broided hair, or gold, or pearls, or costly array"



Masking Nakedness

"**adorn** themselves in **modest** apparel"

A Christian's clothing should cover their nakedness

Modest clothing covers the body. Mankind's "naked" region spans "from the loins even unto the thighs" (Exodus 28:40-43; see also Isaiah 47:1-3). Our clothing must fully cover this area of our body for us to not be considered by God to be naked, because nakedness is shamefulness (Revelation 3:18; 16:15).

A Christian's clothing should display a gender-difference

Modest clothing has an observable difference between men and women, because cross-dressing is an abomination to God (Deuteronomy 22:5). Historically, as well as in Biblical times, Men have always worn trousers and shorts ("breeches": Exodus 28:42; "hosen": Daniel 3:21), and women have always worn dresses and skirts (Nahum 3:5; Jeremiah 13:26).

"with **shamefacedness**"

A Christian's clothing should be decent and unrevealing

Modest clothing is **shamefaced**, not vain or revealing clothing which shows the body or suggests the body to potential observers (Proverbs 7:10). Our clothing should not be a temptation to others (Romans 14:13, 21).

- Efficient in Design

"and sobriety"

A Christian's clothing should be practical and functional

Modest clothing is **serious**, not men-pleasing or trendy. We should wear clothing which has a functional purpose (Isaiah 23:17-18). We should also avoid clothing that brands and associates us with the world (Romans 12:1-2).









Simple in Style

"not with broided hair"

A Christian's clothing should be uncomplicated and basic

Modest clothing is **simple**, not complicated, or showy. Our clothing can be stylish, but it should not be showy (Ezekiel 16:10). Makeup is generally unnatural and whorish (2 Kings 9:30; Jeremiah 4:30; see also Proverbs 6:25).









- Thrifty in Price

"or gold, or pearls, or costly array"

A Christian's clothing should be cost-efficient and affordable

Modest clothing is **sensible**, not expensive or costly. An immodest person dresses in a covetous manner (Acts 20:33; see also Luke 12:15; Hebrews 13:5; 1 Timothy 6:10), wearing unnecessarily expensive things.

Dress S.M.A.R.T. for Church



Whenever we come to church, we should normally **dress our best**, with the cleanest and most formal clothing we have, in a S.M.A.R.T. way.

2 Chronicles 9:3-4 "And when the queen of Sheba had seen **the wisdom** of Solomon ... 4 ... and the attendance of his ministers, and **their apparel**; his cupbearers also, and **their apparel**; and his ascent by which he went up into **the house of the LORD**; there was no more spirit in her."



Sober in Life

Church is a **serious event**, at which we ought to be dressed in a fashion that shows we are serious about it (Titus 2:2,4,6).



-Modest in Appearance

Church is a **holy place**, which requires that we be well-dressed and not drawing attention to ourselves by our poor choice of poor clothes.



-Appropriate to Occasion

Church is a **great occasion**, where we should dress as if it were more important than any other meeting (Ephesians 3:21), including weddings and other formal gatherings.



- Reverential to God

Church is a **solemn gathering**, where we should show our respect for the house of the Lord (Leviticus 19:30).



- Testimony to Others

Church is a **public activity**, in which we can be a good testimony for Christ by the way we dress (2 Corinthians 3:2).



A good friend is an **instructive** person

Befriend those who are able to counsel, admonish and exhort you (Proverbs 27:9) and who rebuke you when you are wrong (Proverbs 27:6).



Proverbs 27:17 "Iron sharpeneth iron; so a man sharpeneth the countenance of his friend."



-Neighbourly A good friend is a helpful person

Befriend those who will love (Proverbs 17:9), **help**, and **comfort** you (Acts 27:3).




Proverbs 27:10 "Thine own friend, and thy father's friend, forsake not; ... better is a neighbour that is near than a brother far off."

A good friend is a **consistent** person

good F.R.I.E.N.D. to others.




Be Soul-Conscious


Be Much-Involved

"A man that hath friends must shew himself friendly" (Proverbs 18:24), so **be a sociable individual** who is **socially active in every way**.




Be Christ-Like



The Lord's Prayer Model

In his sample prayer, Jesus gave his disciples a model for how we should be regularly praying to our heavenly Father, in the name of the Son, through the power of the Holy Spirit (Ephesians 2:18). The Lord's Prayer is a **model** to be patterned after, not a **chant** to be repeated.

Pray with P.O.W.E.R.

In order for God to be more likely to hear us and answer our requests, there are several things we can do to **strengthen our prayers** to God.

There will be **power in our prayer** if we pray a **prayer of P.O.W.E.R**.

Persuesion

Ask God for things with **convincing reasons**, **believing** that God will hear you

Matthew 21:22 "And all things, whatsoever ye shall

ask in prayer, **believing**, ye shall receive."

- Out Loud

Ask God for things speaking your requests out loud and **using your voice**

Psalm 142:1 "I cried unto the LORD with my voice; with my voice unto the LORD did I make my supplication."

God's Will Of God



Meet for **daily prayer** with others without ceasing, where you can pray as companions (Acts 2:42).



Prayer **Teams**



Schedule seasonal **prayer teams**, where you can pray as a community (Acts 12:5).



Planned

All praying for a **theme**

People in a prayer meeting must have a theme that they are praying for.

Matthew 18:19 "Again I say unto you, That if **two of you shall** agree on earth as touching any thing that they shall ask, it shall be done for them of my Father which is in heaven."



All praying **about** the same thing

People in a prayer meeting must all be of one accord and listening to one another.

Acts 1:14 "These all continued with one accord in prayer and supplication..."

Brief

All praying short prayers

People in a prayer meeting must each individually pray for a concise time frame.

Luke 20:47 "Which devour widows' houses, and for a shew make long **prayers**: the same shall receive greater damnation."

Loud

All praying loud enough

People in a prayer meeting must lift up their voices for the benefit of others present.

Acts 4:24 "And when they heard that, they **lifted up their voice to God** with one accord ..."

Intercessory

People in a prayer meeting must typically pray for things and people other than just themselves.

Daniel 2:18 "That they would desire mercies of the God of heaven concerning this secret; that **Daniel and his fellows should not perish** with the rest of the wise men of Babylon."

Concentrated (without being distracted)

People in a prayer meeting must be focused the whole time.

2 Chronicles 7:14 "If my people, which are called by my name, shall **humble** themselves, and pray, and seek my face, and turn from their wicked ways; then will I hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin, and will heal their land."

F.A.S.T. to the Lord

Fasting is **not eating** for the purpose of **requesting something** from God.

Joel 2:12 "Therefore also now, saith the LORD, turn ye even to me with all your heart, and with fasting, and with weeping, and with mourning"







Select a petition you desire from God, and **Sanctify** a timeframe in which to fast

We fast to **receive something from God**, not just for the sake of fasting (Matthew 17:21). In the Bible, God's people fasted for at least one full day (Judges 20:26; 2 Samuel 1:12), but many sometimes fasted for 3 days or more.



- Abstention Stop eating any kind of food during your fast

Eat no food, but only drink water (Matthew 4:2). If the fast is intended for a dramatic need, consider abstaining from water for a short period (Esther 4:16; Jonah 3:7; Acts 9:9).



Substitution Substitute the eating time with prayer time

Spend the time you would have been eating to instead pray for what you are requesting God for (1 Corinthians 7:5).



Transmission

Sacrifice the money you saved for the Lord

Give the money you would have spent on the food during your fast for a godly cause (Isaiah 58:6-7).



On a **private** basis, to be seen of God and not man (Matthew 6:16-18).



On a **weekly** basis, for whatever you have need of (Matthew 9:15; Luke 2:37; Luke 18:12).

Fast Seasonally

On a **special** basis, for whenever you have a unique need (Acts 13:2-3).

Things to fast for

Holiness – to leave something *sinful*(Nehemiah 9:1-2)

Wisdom – to learn something **useful** (Acts 9:9; Exodus 34:28)

Mercy – to be spared from something harmful (2 Samuel 12:16; Esther 4:16)

Direction – to be led in something *fruitful* (Acts 13:3; Ezra 8:21-23)

Blessing – to receive something *helpful* (1 Samuel 1:8, 11, 18)

Pray in Your H.E.A.R.T.

Philippians 4:6 "Be careful for nothing; but in every thing by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known unto God."

In everything you do, you should be **praying in your** heart. Let all of your cares be turned into prayers (1 Peter 5:7), and let God be in all your thoughts (Psalm 10:4). If anything is good to desire, then it is good to pray for, and should be prayed for. Throughout the day, prayerful Christians pray **thousands of times** to God.

Mentally break up the verse(s) you will memorize into quotable chunks, and then repeat each word cluster for about 100 times, and then move on to the next word cluster.

After every new word cluster, **connect** all of the memorized word clusters together 3 times before moving on. Once you finish an entire verse, then repeat the entire verse altogether 3 times.

Think about the meaning of the words and of the verse(s), asking questions to yourself and praying about the truth you learn.

Carry the cards with you verses on **index cards**, one verse wherever you go, and **use all your idle time** to memorize them.



1 Corinthians 7:29 "But this I say, brethren, the time is short"

Time is the **most valuable resource** we have, and yet it is also our most easily wasted resource. The time of your life is like water spilled on the ground, that cannot be gathered up again (2 Samuel 14:14), so **never W.A.S.T.E. a single moment** of your time!










- Waiting

Spending time simply waiting around is time wastage because it is **idleness**. Instead of merely waiting for something or someone, we should apply our hearts to wisdom (Psalm 90:12), and be busy learning or labouring while we wait (Luke 12:35-36).

Isaiah 26:8 "Yea, in the way of thy judgments, O LORD, have we waited for thee; the desire of our soul is to thy name, and to the remembrance of thee."



Watching/listening to most audiovisual media is time wastage because it is **sinfulness**. In contrast to the Bible (Romans 12:2), audiovisual media is filled with worldly programming: e.g., immorality, blasphemy, nudity, vulgarity, and

cruelty (Isaiah 33:15-17).

Psalm 101:3 "I will set no wicked thing before mine eyes: I hate the work of them that turn aside; it shall not cleave to me."



Social Media


Improperly using social media is time wastage because it is **unprofitable**. Most users of social media inevitably become abusers of it (1 Corinthians 7:31). Purposeless and mindless scrolling and viewing is one of the biggest time drains in the modern world.

Colossians 4:5 "Walk in wisdom toward them that are without, **redeeming the time**."



Unwisely having lengthy talks with others is time wastage because it is vain. Avoid having unplanned discourses and discussions with many idle words (Ecclesiastes 10:12-14). Talk is cheap, but teaching is priceless (Proverbs 10:19-21).

Proverbs 14:23 "In all labour there is profit: but the talk of the lips tendeth only to penury."



Entertainment

Immoderately engaging in most forms of entertainment is time wastage because it is **unedifying**. Because there is no eternal impact of recreation (see 1 Corinthians 9:25), the majority Gaming of our time should be taken up in exercising ourselves unto godliness (1 Timothy 4:7-8).

1 Peter 1:17 "...pass the time of your sojourning here in fear"

- (1) **Familiarity**: NT books (e.g., 1 Corinthians) are easier to memorize than OT books (e.g., Hosea).
- (2) **Simplicity**: doctrinal/didactic parts of the Bible (e.g., Ecclesiastes or 1 Timothy) are easier to memorize than narrative (e.g., 1 Samuel or Acts).
- (3) **Brevity**: shorter books (e.g., Colossians) are easier to memorize than longer books (e.g., Matthew).





S.I.N.G. to the Lord

Psalm 40:3 "And he hath put **a new song in my mouth**, even praise unto our God: many shall see it, and fear, and shall trust in the LORD."

In order to be a **true worshipper** of God, you must sing and listen exclusively to the "**songs of the Lord**" (1 Chronicles 25:7; 7:6). The music of the Lord which you should S.I.N.G. has four characteristics.

Spiritua [

(Hallowed Music)

Sing music which stirs your spirit

Galatians 5:16 "This I say then, **Walk in the Spirit**, and ye shall not fulfil the lust of the flesh."

Music of the Lord is not carnal, because it **activates the mind** instead of the body. There are two aspects of music (Ephesians 5:19): **lyrical** ("singing") and **musical** ("making melody"). How music is played, and the instruments which are involved must be God-honoring (See Psalm 150). Worldly music attracts the unclean spirits of the world just as godly music drives them away (1 Samuel 16:14-23).

Sing music which edifies your soul

Music of the Lord is not foolish or vain, but is **biblical** and **edifying**. As in the book of Psalms, our songs should be **doctrinal** (Psalm 49:3-4). God's music has educational value to it (1 Samuel 18:10; 2 Kings 3:15; 1 Chronicles 25:1). Worldly music is shallow and uneducational (Ecclesiastes 7:5). Sing God's words (Psalm 119:54).

Music of the Lord is not patterned after the world, but is its own unique genre. Peculiar people should have peculiar music (Deuteronomy 14:2). Worldly music is of the world's genres (e.g., "Rock," "Pop," "Rap," "Country," "Jazz," "Gospel," etc.), and not of the Father (1 John 2:15-17; James 4:4).

The most frequent command in the Bible is to "praise the Lord" (Psalm 150:6). Worldly music causes the participant to sin (Daniel 3:4-6; Isaiah 23:16).





Sing to God with **all of your being** whenever you sing, so that you "make the voice of his praise to be heard" (Psalm 66:8). When you are truly praising the Lord, you must **shout to him** (Ezra 3:11), and sing L.O.U.D.



Psalm 81:1 "**Sing aloud** unto God our strength: make a joyful noise unto the God of Jacob."



Use your **full and strong** voice to sing to God; sing from your **chest**, not merely from your **throat**.



Use your **whole voice** and **open mouth** to sing to God; employ all your vocal strength.



Improve your posture to sing to God; Do not **slouch** or **bend**, but stand/sit **straight**.



Involve **your emotions** when you sing to God; Be **joyous** if the music is uplifting, be **somber** if the music is melancholic, etc.

Psalm 98:4 "Make a **joyful noise unto the LORD**, all the earth: make a **loud noise**, and rejoice, and sing praise."








Give Your T.I.T.H.E.

Tithing is the giving of 10% of what you receive to the Lord.








1/10th of your income is not your money, but God's (Leviticus 27:30). People who do not pay tithes are **robbers of God**; those who fail to tithe will be cursed, but those who T.I.T.H.E. will be blessed (Malachi 3:8-10).

Deuteronomy 14:22-23, 25 "22 **Thou shalt truly tithe all the increase** of thy seed, that the field bringeth forth year by year. 23 And thou shalt eat before the LORD thy God, in the place which he shall choose to place his name there, the tithe of thy corn, of thy wine, and of thine oil, and the firstlings of thy herds and of thy flocks; **that thou mayest learn to fear the LORD thy God always**. 25 ... and shalt go unto the place which the LORD thy God shall choose"



at least 10%

"all the increase"

Tithe **faithfully**, on all that you get, or the "increase" (Deuteronomy 14:22, 28; 26:12). The tithe is "the tenth" of what you get, 10% of everything you receive (Numbers 18:21); it is God's tax on all that you receive of monetary value (Genesis 28:22; Luke 18:12), including gifts.

Tithe **immediately**, as your "firstfruits" (Exodus 23:19; Proverbs 3:9), which is given immediately when you are compensated or gifted with some amount.

Tithe **genuinely**, taking the total income, before taxes, and before debts or payments.

"thou wilt also do more than I say" (Philemon 21)

Tithe **generously**, not merely giving precisely 10%, but even more (Matthew 5:41). You can be cursed for giving less than 10%, but you can only be blessed if you give more (2 Corinthians 9:6).

Give Your A.L.M.s

Righteous people consider and seek out the poor (Deuteronomy 15:7-11; Luke 12:33), and God has a blessing for them who give to poor people continually (Proverbs 28:27), and a curse for those who do not (Proverbs 21:13). Give your A.L.M.s to the true "poor"

Proverbs 29:7 "The righteous considereth the cause of the poor: but the wicked regardeth not to know it."

When we give money to the poor, we should give our alms privately, so that our good deed is not done for show (Matthew 6:1-4).







Afflicted

of the Earth

Give alms to a poor Needy Person

Our alms should go to those who are in actual need, and are truly poor and destitute (James 2:15), not liars, or people who could do well without it.



Deuteronomy 15:7-8 "7 If there be among you a poor man of one of thy brethren within any of thy gates in thy land which the LORD thy God giveth thee, thou shalt not harden thine heart, nor shut thine hand from thy poor **brother**: 8 But thou shalt open thine hand wide unto him, and shalt surely lend him **sufficient for his need**, in that which he wanteth."



Our alms should go to those who are busy and hard-working people. Never support the lazy who refuse to work (Psalm 37:25; Proverbs 20:4; 21:25). If we give to a slothful person, we are simply supporting their wicked lifestyle, and God will not respect this as alms.

Give alms to a poor Believing Person

Our alms should most often go to the "brethren" (1 John 3:17; James 2:15-16), not for unbelievers. Alms should be collected/laid out for faithful church members (Matthew 25:40), and not those who forsake the assembly (1 Corinthians 16:1). Most of our giving should be through the local church.

Galatians 6:10 "As we have therefore opportunity, let us do good unto all men, especially unto them who are of the household of faith."

Steward Your M.O.N.I.E.S.

Deuteronomy 8:18 "But thou shalt remember the LORD thy God: for it is he that giveth thee power to get wealth..."

Because everything you have comes from God (1 Chronicles 29:12), you are the steward of all the things you possess; handle your M.O.N.I.E.S. wisely (Luke 16:10-12).

Manage Pray & Budget

First, pray about how God would have you use it, and make a financial budget 1 Corinthians 4:2 "Moreover it is required in stewards, that a man be found faithful."

Second, set apart money for the Lord, and for others

Galatians 6:6 "Let him that is taught in the word communicate unto him that teacheth in all good things."

Third, apportion the necessary money for your living and housing expenses

1 Timothy 5:8 "But if any provide not for **his own**, and specially for **those** of his own house, he hath denied the faith, and is worse than an infidel."

Investings Ministries & Missions

Fourth, invest a certain sum of money into kingdom purposes Matthew 6:20 "But lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust doth corrupt, and where

thieves do not break through nor steal"

Encumbrances Expenses & Debts

Fifth, cover your unexpected expenses and incurred debts Romans 13:8 "Owe no man any thing, but to love one another: for he that loveth another hath fulfilled the law."

Future Fund & Emergency Fund

Sixth, save up a certain fixed amount for a 3-to-6 month emergency fund (Proverbs 15:6; Psalm 112:3), and also save an amount for known future purchases or events.

Biblical Budgeting

Draft a budget to determine how you will use all of the money which you recieve

Singleness

Be totally concentrating on what you are doing (Ephesians 6:5; Colossians 3:22). A single-hearted persons' mind is not somewhere else when they work.

Give your best effort in what you do (Ephesians 6:6; Colossians 3:23). A whole-hearted person wholly and solely exerts themselves for a given job (Psalm 119:2, 10, 34, 58, 69, 145).

Work with **desire and passion** for what you are doing (Good: Nehemiah 4:6; Bad: Nehemiah 3:5). A right-hearted person is afraid to do a bad job, labouring "with fear and trembling" (Ephesians 6:7; Colossians 3:24-25).

Obediently (Righteousness)

Work in an accountable way toward others (Titus 2:10). Don't steal from others **Righteous** (Leviticus 19:11), nor lie to them (Amos 8:4-6 Micah 6:10-12), including your bosses.

Work in a **respectful** way toward your superiors (Ephesians 6:5; 1 Peter 2:18). Honour your masters and customers (1 Timothy 6:1-5) Respectful and seek to please them well in all things (Titus 2:9).

Work in an **independent** way toward your work (Ephesians 6:6). Labour **Responsible** without needing supervision, working mostly without the need of constant direction-giving (Proverbs 6:6-8). Do not be a men-pleaser who does the minimum or only what people can see (Proverbs 20:7).



Work **until the end**, not just at the beginning (Ecclesiastes 7:8). Show care in your duties by being diligent unto the end (Proverbs 12:24; 22:29), and never fail to complete your work (Proverbs 10:26; 26:6 Ecclesiastes 10:15).
